## SMOKE FREE FOSTER CARE IN MINNESOTA

In MN all child foster care homes must be smoke free and prevent secondhand exposure to children per MN 260C.215, Subd. 4, 6 & 9. This includes inside the home as well as any space connected to the home, including a garage, porch, deck, or similar space; all outdoor areas on the premises of the home when a foster child is present; and in a motor vehicle in which a foster child is transported. If a foster parent fails to provide a smoke-free environment for a foster child, the child-placing agency must ask the foster parent to comply with a plan that includes training on the health risks of exposure to secondhand smoke.
